## Lesson plan:

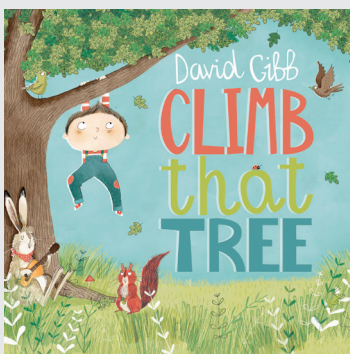
### The Cat Came Too

#### Activity

1. Listen to the song *The Cat Came Too* from David Gibb's album *Climb That Tree*. Print the lyrics sing and along with the song.
2. Read the lyrics out loud to the class. As a group discuss William and Toby's friendship. Was Toby a good friend to William? Was William right to forgive Toby? What makes a good friend?
3. As individuals ask the children to make a list of 10 qualities that they think a good friend should have.
4. Share these together and then in groups ask the children to discuss what Toby could have done differently in order to be a better friend.

#### Extension Activities

1. Write a letter from Toby to William apologising for jumping in the river and getting him wet. Think about ways that Toby might be able to make it up to William.
2. It's quite unusual for a cat and a dog to be friends! Try writing your own song or story about a pair of unlikely friends and the adventures they might get up to.
